K K Walling is an artist who specializes in plein air landscape using oils. She tries to capture the light, shadow, color or mood and convey that feeling to the viewer.

She is a signature member of the National Oil and Acrylic Painters Society as well as a member of Oil Painters of America. Plein Air Artists of Colorado, Plein Air Painters New Mexico, American Impressionist Society, and a founding member of the Plein Air Painters of the Four Corners. With these groups she exhibits regionally and nationally as well as being juried into other national shows.

Having traveled to workshops with nationally known painters has encouraged and inspired her. Some of these are: George Cherepov, Howard Carr, Ann Templeton, George Strickland, Kenn Backhaus and in watercolor, John Pellew, Milford Zornes, Frank Webb, Judi Bettis as well as others.

K K Walling has a wide variety of teaching experiences from setting up an art program for 5th grade through High School at Navajo United Methodist Mission School

and teaching there for 8 years; teaching painting at Senior Citizens Center to being adjunct instructor in the art department of San Juan College, Farmington, teaching oil, acrylic and watercolor for many years. Also she has taught plein air short courses for San Juan College.
